Present the 35th Annual Emergency Vehicle Display Show & Law Enforcement Recruitment Fair Saturday, October 4, 2025, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Ripon Community Center & Park, 334 West Fourth Street, Ripon, California 95366

The show is a pro public safety family event. Vehicles of all types will attend, including police, fire, ambulance, and military. All proceeds are donated to the Ripon Police Volunteers and Explorers, the California Law Enforcement Historical Society, and the CHP Historical Museum. Congratulations to our 2024 Best of Show winner, Sgt. Adam Stovall, and the 2014 Bell Helicopter from the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Office.

After much consideration, I have made the decision to have 2025 be my final year as the Coordinator for the Ripon car show portion of the show. Coordinating this show since 1990 alongside my wife, Marla, and my brother Scott has been one of the highlights of my life, however, after 35 years, it's time to "pass the baton." I'm happy that we were able to create a positive, social event where LE and the public could come together to enjoy a large-scale public safety vehicle display and help put the hobby of police vehicle restoration on the map. With that, I'm pleased to announce that our new show Coordinator will be Mr. Jeff Orlando and his wife, Tami, both of whom have extensive experience in public service (Santa Clara Police and Fire) and in event coordination.

<u>Vehicle Entry</u> Public agency vehicles are FREE, privately owned vehicles are \$40.00 for preregistration, \$45.00 for day of show. This show is open to any current or vintage vehicles including, Police, CHP, public relations/CSO/ volunteers, K9, mobile command, SWAT, ambulance, fire trucks, motorcycles, security, and military vehicles. Agency owned vehicles of any year are permitted. Privately owned vehicles must be at least 20 years old, unless they are unmarked/unequipped for the "daily driver" class. This year we are adding "on-line" registration options.

<u>Recruitment Booth</u> Public safety agencies are welcome to set up a recruitment booth free of charge, with a marked vehicle. Private public safety related businesses may set up a booth for a \$50.00 fee. <u>Swap Meet</u> Spaces are available; all items must be hobby related only. The cost is \$50.00 per space. <u>*Cruise, Parade, and other Information*</u> on Friday October 3 at 6 p.m., there will be a cruise starting from the Community Center. On Saturday, October 4 at 1:00 p.m., there will be a slow speed "code 3" parade. Both events are overseen and coordinated by the Ripon Police Dept.

<u>Emergency Vehicle Show Classes</u>

Best of Show This winning entry will be selected by our expert judges. Any vehicle in any class is eligible.

Best Restored and Novelty Police Vehicle, vehicle years 1900-2005 This class includes original police vehicles (non-police package cars that were used as a police vehicle) or a police package vehicle. Also includes vehicles that are not original or police package vehicles but have been restored to resemble one. It also includes law enforcement related TV and movie police cars.

Display Vehicle This class includes vehicles that are exempt from judging. Vehicles in this class may be owned by show volunteers, or participants that do not wish to be judged. Vehicles in this class may be awarded by Police Chief's choice, Chicago Police Award, or Sponsorship Family Award.

<u>Best Restored Special Service Pursuit Package Vehicle</u> This class includes any police package, Mustang or Camaro that is privately owned.

<u>Best Specialty Vehicle</u> This class includes public agency vehicles used for traffic enforcement, SWAT, K-9, bomb squads, prisoner transport, vehicles within the title, and others as determined.

Best Police Motorcycle This class includes restored or current, agency or privately owned police motorcycles.

Best Fire, Ambulance, Medical, Military or Professional Vehicle This class includes any restored or current fire vehicle, ambulance, medical, military, or professional vehicle, privately or publicly owned.

<u>Best In Service Police Vehicle</u> This class includes any current vehicle owned by a public agency used for routine patrol, and not covered in the Specialty class.

Best In Service Security, Tow Truck or Daily Driver Vehicle This class includes any security vehicle, tow truck, or daily driver vehicle. A Daily Driver vehicle is defined as a vehicle that can be a prior police package vehicle now privately owned, without markings or equipment, or other similar plain looking vehicles.

<u>Best Public Relations, Volunteer, Recruitment, Explorer, C.S.O. or Cadet Emergency Vehicle</u> This class includes public agency or privately owned vehicles used in the above related fields.

<u>Police Chief's Choice</u> Two vehicles will be selected from any class by Ripon Police Chief Daniel Sauer and Menlo Park Police Chief David Norris.

<u>Chicago Police Award</u> One vehicle from any class will be selected by retired Sergeant Greg Reynolds of the Chicago Police Department.

<u>Sponsorship Family Award</u> One vehicle from any class will be selected by retired Menlo Park Police Chief Bruce Cumming.

Entry fee on show day is \$45.00 (cash or check only). Payment may be made via Paypal, check (made out to the show), money order or cash. You will receive an email confirmation number if pre-registered prior to the show.

Vehicle registration will begin on Saturday at 08:00 a.m. <u>All vehicles MUST arrive by 09:30</u> <u>Saturday morning to be included in the judging and vehicle photography portion of the show</u>. PLEASE be patient. We cannot photograph your vehicle for an award until we have sufficient sunlight. Our team of volunteers do their best to get you processed through registration and photography as soon as possible. PLEASE stay in your vehicle as we cannot move the line if you are not there. **SWAT** trucks, Fire trucks, vehicles with trailers, etc., please enter on the S. Locust Avenue side where you will be directed to park for display. Once parked, remember to go to the registration table near the 4th Street entrance for your entry information and packet.

SHOW RULES, JUDGING AND PARADE INFORMATION, ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS, LODGING AND DIRECTIONS

<u>JUDGING INFORMATION</u>: All vehicles MUST arrive by 09:30 to be included in the vehicle photography and judging portion of the show. Vehicles arriving after this time will still be permitted into the show until 10:00 am when registration closes but will not have a photograph taken. These time constraints are required to allow sufficient time for the judges to view the vehicles. Not every vehicle will fit into a designated class; staff reserves the right to place a vehicle in the most appropriate show class.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION: Vehicle registration will begin at 08:00 a.m. PLEASE be patient. We cannot photograph your vehicle for an award until we have sufficient sunlight. Our team of volunteers do their best to get you processed through registration and photography as soon as possible. **PLEASE stay in your vehicle as we can't move the line if you're not there**.

Please have your vehicle "show ready" upon arrival, ready to be photographed. Please place display signage behind your vehicle so it can be photographed more easily on the field. Surround ropes around vehicles are prohibited. **Personal tents (EZ ups) MUST BE ANCHORED,** and you must inform staff when you park. **Dogs must be leashed. There will be police dogs in the area. Helicopters will be flying in and out.** Pre-registration & Day of Show entries: Goodie bags for all can be picked up AFTER 09:30 at the raffle/t-shirt tables by the DJ at the front.

PARADE INFORMATION: The parade begins at approximately 1 p.m. and the staging area for the parade will be announced by Ripon Police Dept prior to the parade beginning. The **Ripon Police Department supervises the parade** and the starting time and will advise you of safety and parade rules. Only vehicles that are registered in the show can participate in the parade. Exterior vehicle music, or any type of public address system is prohibited. Vehicle sirens are permitted.
